THE 115TH BRIGADE, A COMMAND AND CONTROL HEADQUARTERS, WAS UNDER THE CONTROL OF THE 1ST REPUBLIC OF KOREA CORPS, AND SHARED STRATEGY AND TACTICS WITH OUR KOREAN COUNTERPARTS.

OUR THIRD BATTALION TRAINED WITH KOREAN ARTILLERY BATTALIONS

AND OCCUPIED POSITION AFTER POSITION AS THE SIMULATED BATTLE RAGED.

ARTILLERY BATTERIES MOVED THEIR HUGE GUNS

AND VEHICLES INTO RICE PADDIES, FIELDS, AND ANY OTHER OPEN SPOT ASSIGNED TO THEM BY HIGHER HEADQUARTERS.
