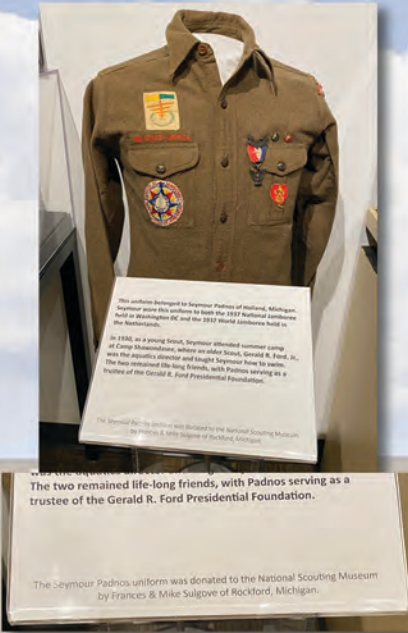
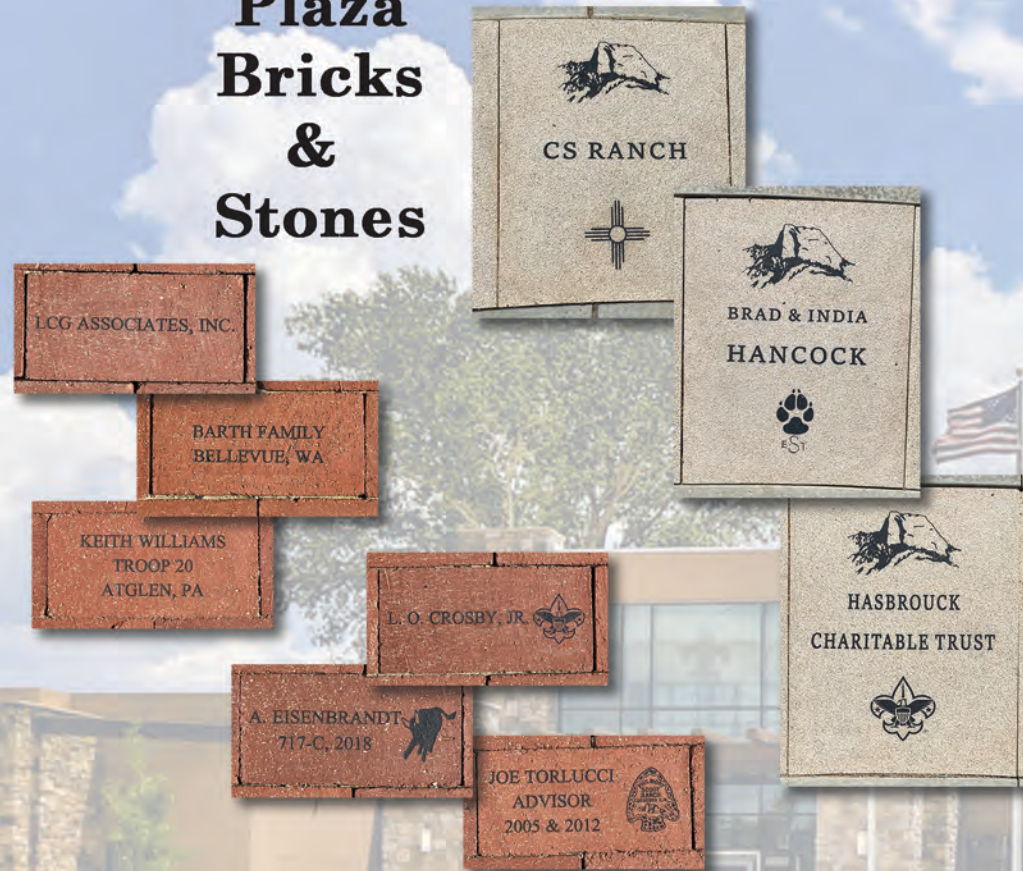

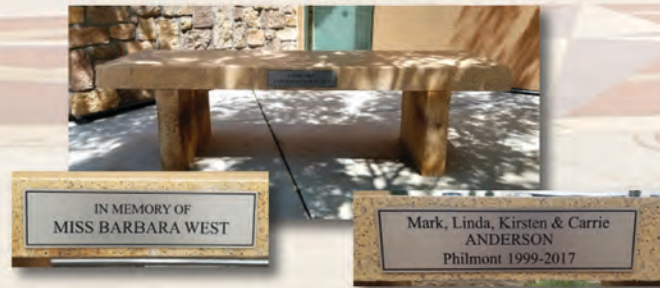

# DONOR DESIGNATION/DONOR RESTRICTION

All monetary donations to the National Scouting Museum are Donor Designated/Donor Restricted. We currently have four categories of Donor Designations//Donor Restrictions for you to choose from. Below you will find these four categories, along with a brief explanation to assist you with making this important decision regarding your donation.

## NSM Endowment –

Donations restricted to this fund will be directly deposited into the National Scouting Museum Endowment. The endowment will be invested, and allocations from the earnings of these investments will be transferred to the Museum’s cost center to serve as the basis of budgeting for the year and cover the operational expenses of the Museum.

## NSM Program and Exhibits –

Donations restricted to this fund will be used to finance the development, production, delivery, and upkeep of programs and exhibits of the Museum. An example of this could include designing and creating a temporary exhibit in one of the Museum’s galleries. It could also include the acquisition (purchase or loan) of an artifact for the Museum’s collection or the cost of renting an exhibit for a special event or purpose. This could also include purchasing items such as the NSM Scouting Heritage Merit Badge patch, which is given to Scouts working on the Scouting Heritage Merit Badge.

## NSM Capital Projects –

Donations restricted to this fund will be used to finance specific projects at the National Scouting Museum. These projects could include items such as display cases, equipment, materials, and other purchases that are outside of the standard annual purchase planning program of the Museum. In general, these expenditures will be under \$5,000 per occurrence.

## NSM Educational Outreach –

Donations restricted to this fund will be used to finance educational outreach programs, such as the expenses related to the development and delivery of programs to schools and other groups that visit the museum. An example of this could include the costs to develop and produce handout materials for a local school group to enhance their visit to the Museum. Another example would be to develop presentation materials for a group that has requested special educational support for their visit to the Museum.



# DONOR RECOGNITION

Depending on the size of your donation, we have various ways to recognize you for your generosity and interest in supporting the Mission of the National Scouting Museum.

## MUSEUM PLAZA BRICKS & STONES

Donors who make a \$300 donation will be recognized with a customized commemorative brick placed in the Museum plaza. Donors who make a \$4,000 donation will be recognized with a commemorative stone in the Museum plaza. Multiple bricks can be placed adjacent to each other. Some donors choose to combine contributions and have their donations recognized with a combination of bricks and stones.

## MUSEUM PLAZA GRANITE BENCH

For a donor interested in making a \$10,000 donation to the Museum, we have a limited number of granite benches where a 3”x13” plaque can be engraved and affixed to the front of the bench.

## MUSEUM DISPLAY CASE

The National Scouting Museum will be undergoing a major upgrade in 2022-2024 and the opportunity for a donor to participate in this upgrade begins with sponsoring a display case for a \$30,000 donation. Each case in the gallery will be available to an individual sponsor in areas such as advancement, inclusion and diversity, Cub Scouts, Senior Scouts, and temporary displays. ## INDIVIDUAL ARTIFACT

As part of the major upgrade being conducted in 2022-2024, there is an opportunity for a donor to support the National Scouting Museum by sponsoring an individual artifact in a larger display. The sponsorship for an individual artifact is \$5,000 - \$10,000 depending on the artifact being sponsored. Contact the Museum for specific sponsorship details.
